In this step, the nurse can identify the related or risk factors and defining characteristics that can be used to formulate a nursing diagnosis. What physical or medical conditions are involved? Monitor the patient for choking or coughing before, during, or after swallowing. How does the caregiver feel? Polypharmacy in older adults is a significant risk factor for falls. Has the vision problem been evaluated medically? Identify the goal s : The goal has to come before the plan of action. Does the client of family have financial resources to modify the home? How often are batteries changed? A fall is more likely to be experienced by an individual if the surrounding is not familiar such as the placement of furniture and equipment in a certain area. Is the client aware of the problem? Is the behavior or emotional problem effecting people outside the home? Can further treatment be helpful? What are the resources for drug treatment in the area for people with disabilities that the client has? How does the family view the problem? Are they effective? In stating reasons for problems it becomes clear that not only are the causes themselves divisable into the categories of physical, psychosocial and environmental, but the information needs surrounding any one cause could also be divided in the same way.
